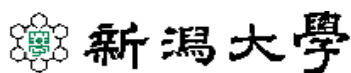

However, the current regional institutions are widely regarded too soft to deal with these hard problems. East Asia has been the engine of the global growth while its future remains uncertain. But its future will largely depend on the two major threads: multilateral regional integration and major power interactions (China-Japan-U.S. relations in particular). The course aims to analyze the dynamism of East Asia international relations by tracing the historical and undergoing development of the above mentioned two threads.

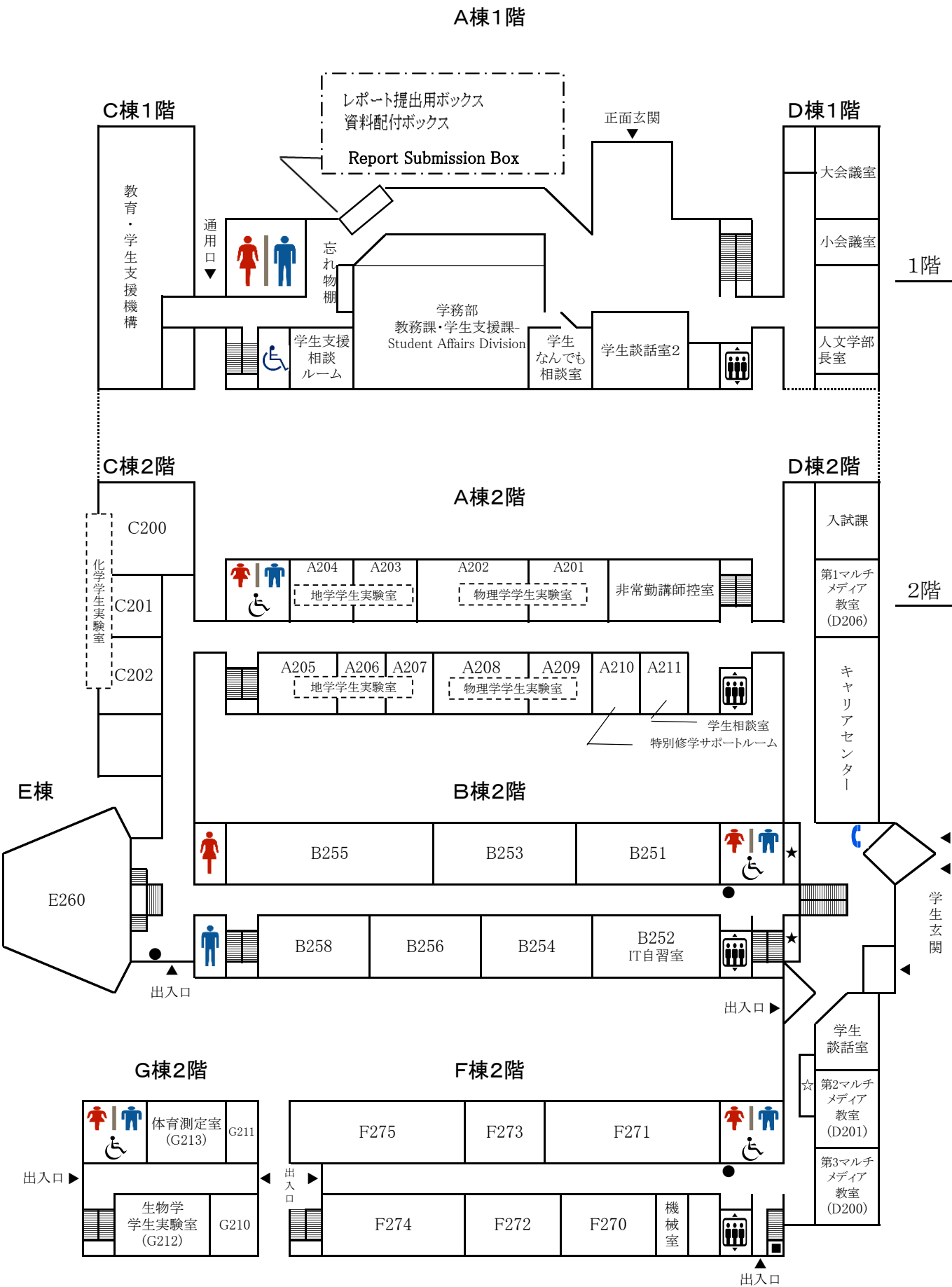
