# 1. Aims and Objectives

With the slogan of "Crossing All Boundaries and Sharing Your Ideas", the 3rd Japan-Russia Student Forum will take place online from 12 to 13, September, 2021. Since <sup>\*1</sup>the 2nd Japan-Russia Student Forum (held at Moscow State University in September 2019), <sup>\*2</sup>the Japan-Russia Student Union has been launched by students from both countries. However, since COVID-19 gave our society a big impact, students have continued to do activities together online. Looking ahead to the era of after COVID-19, students from both countries will exchange ideas and opinions across countries, places, universities, specialties, languages, and cultures so as to open up a new era. English (additional: Japanese or Russian)


## 6. Numbers of Participants

- (1) Participants will be decided based on the application documents.
- (2) International Office of Niigata University will inform an applicant of the selection result by email within 10 days after application deadline.
