Furumachi Geigi Performance:



What is Geigi?

The geisha of Furumachi, called geigi, are highly skilled artists who perform traditional Japanese dance, accompanied by shamisen (a three-stringed traditional instrument) music and singing. Events are regularly organized at traditional Japanese restaurants in Furumachi, allowing guests to enjoy geigi performances, along with witty conversations and parlor games, in private tatami rooms.

History

During the Edo period (1603-1867), Furumachi was a flourishing port town that attracted sailors and merchants from all over Japan. Its lively geisha quarter was considered one of the Japan's top three entertainment districts, alongside Gion in Kyoto and Shinbashi in Tokyo. Today, Furumachi is a business area of Niigata City that still retains the old days atmosphere and where it is possible to experience an authentic geisha performance. * JNTO (Japan National Tourism Organization)

Sake Barrel Opening:

What is Sake barrel opening?

The sake barrel opening ceremony ("Kagami wari" or "Kagami biraki" in Japanese) is a traditional Japanese ceremony where the sake barrel is broken using a mallet. This is to wish health and well-being at times of celebration and new beginnings.





 How to proceed the barrel opening at the NU's celebratory party
 <u>We invite one participant (the highest-ranking official) from each institution to</u> <u>take the stage and participate in the barrel opening during the party.</u>
 For details on how to proceed with the event, please see the directions below.

- (1) Guests will be notified when to participate in the barrel opening and asked to gather around the stage for preparation.
- (2) Guests will receive a mallet and a traditional Japanese happi coat. Please wear the happi coat, take to the stage and stand by the sake barrels.
- (3) Guests use the wooden mallet to break open the barrel's spherical lid, symbolizing good fortune.
- (4) Please walk off the stage and take off the happi coat.

History

The fourth Tokugawa shogun, Tokugawa letsuna, initiated this ceremony 300 years ago. Before going to war, he gathered his daimyo (feudal lords) in his castle to break open a sake cask. When victory was achieved, this practice became a tradition. Nowadays, the ceremony occurs at various events, including weddings, housewarmings, and company openings.
