## Application Guidelines

### 1. About Residence Halls

In order to provide its students with reliable, convenient on-campus accommodation, Niigata University established the following two residence halls. They are managed by the director of Division of Campus Life Support, the Institute of Education and Student Affairs in accordance with the Regulations of Niigata University Residence Halls.

Please be advised that the Ikarashi Hall is an aging facility, and air conditioning units are not installed. Due to the limited electrical capacity of the building, residents are not permitted to install or bring in their own air conditioning units. At present, it is also difficult to carry out electrical capacity expansion work.

As both the building and its facilities are deteriorating, there have been cases where applicants withdraw after visiting the Residence Halls, or residents decide to leave shortly after moving in.

Prospective residents are strongly encouraged to visit the dormitory in advance. Applications will only be accepted from those who fully understand and agree to the above conditions. For details on how to apply for a dormitory visit, please refer to page 6, section "11. Visit Application."

## 3. Application Submission Period and Announcement of Admission

Applications will be accepted by e-mail or in person. Applications submitted by postal mail or after the application period will not be accepted. If you submit your application in person, the reception hours are from 8:30 to 17:15. In-person submissions are not accepted on Saturdays, Sundays, or national holidays. Please note that incomplete documents may not be considered.

#### 4. Items to be submitted

Please submit the following items by e-mail or in person.

In the case that description written in the application documents turn out to be false, permission granted may be invalidated.

Financial Circumstances Report (for Private-financed International Students)	Use the designated form
A copy of Enrollment Certificate or Notification of Admission	A certificate of the applicant's status at Niigata University after April 1, 2026. If the enrollment certificate has not been issued before the deadline, you should submit a copy of your admission ticket for examination, and submit a copy of the enrollment certificate by Wednesday, March 11, 2026. Research student who plans to apply for an extension of the research student period must first submit a certificate of student registration, and as soon as the extension is permitted submit a copy of the certificate of permission.
A copy of residence card (Both sides)	Only if you are residing in Japan at the time of application.
A copy of passport	A copy of a page that provides personal information including the applicant's name as well as a page that specifies present status of residence.
Information Sheet	Use a designated form. Applicants will be notified of their application number by the contact address.

#### Notes

- (1) Do not use pencils or erasable pens (Frixion pens, etc.).
- (2) If application documents are incomplete with missing documents or unclear points, they will not be considered for selection.

## Guidelines for International Students' Admission to Niigata University Residence Halls

Approved by International Exchange Commission's Special Committee on January 31, 2012

### (Purposes)

I The Guidelines set forth rules concerning the selection of international students to be admitted to a Residence Hall, based on those of Niigata University Residence Hall Rules.

### (Definition)

II In the Guidelines, the meanings of the terms listed in the following items shall be as prescribed respectively in those items.

- (1) Rikka Residence Hall: Niigata University Rikka Residence Hall.
- (2) Ikarashi Residence Hall: Niigata University Ikarashi Residence Hall.
- (3) International student: An international student who is permitted to stay in Japan with a status of residence "Student" or those who are expecting to have this status of residence.

### (Qualification of Applicants)

III Applicants for Rikka and Ikarashi Residence Halls must meet the following conditions to qualify.

- (1) To be admitted to Rikka Residence Hall, an applicant must be enrolled as a degree-seeking student in Niigata University or must be scheduled to enroll as such at the time of lodging application.
- (2) To be admitted to Ikarashi Residence Hall, an applicant must be enrolled as a degree-seeking undergraduate student in Niigata University or must be scheduled to enroll as such at the time of lodging application.

### (Application Period for Residence Halls)

IV The period of application will be announced separately. When there are vacancies, additional applications will be accepted after an announcement.

### (Selection Standards and Process)

V Selection standards of applicants and process will be as follows.

- (1) Students who wish to be admitted to a residence hall must submit application documents (with required attachment) during a specified period set forth in a separate rule.
- (2) The selection for residents of Rikka Residence Hall will be based on application documents.

The status of applicants must be one of those described below at the time of moving in the Residence Hall. New applicants will be given priority. In the case that there are large numbers of applicants, a draw will determine who is accepted.

- ① Privately-financed international students (excluding foreign government dispatch students)
  - ② Japanese government scholarship students
  - ③ Foreign government dispatch students
- (3) The selection for residents of Ikarashi Residence Hall will be based on application

documents. In the case that there are large numbers of applicants, a draw will determine who is accepted, giving priority to newly enrolled undergraduate students.

(Period of Residence Permitted)

VI As a rule, residence permit for international students will be either minimum period required for graduation or for two years. Priority will be given to the earlier day. This rule is not applied to residents who were admitted to reside before April 1,2012

. Additional Guidelines on Selection Standards for International Students' Admission and Period of Residence Permitted

Approved by International Exchange Commission's Special Committee on January 31, 2012

(Purposes)

I As to non-degree-seeking students, guidelines on Selection Standards and period of residence permitted are as follows.

(Application)

II Applications of non-degree-seeking students who are currently enrolled or will enroll at Niigata University will be accepted if only there is vacancy.

(Period of Residence Permitted)

III Non-degree-seeking students are allowed to stay in residence hall during the period that they are allowed to enroll at Niigata University.

(Extension of Residence Period)

IV In the case that non-degree-seeking students, who are currently residing in Rikka Residence Hall wish to extend their stay to the next year, they will be allowed only if there is vacancy.

2. In the case that described above, their residence period will be no more than two years from the date they commence to reside in Rikka Residence Hall.
